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Nexus Innovation Hub and Incubator

According to the NITI Aayog report on Entrepreneurship in India, the lack of effective business incubators is among the three identified shortcomings that need to be addressed in order to evolve a dynamic ecosystem for innovation and entrepreneurship in India. An essential part of Prime Minister Modi's Start-up India initiative is establishing business incubators, and yet quality in-country models are hard to find.

Nexus is an innovation hub and startup incubator created by the U.S. Embassy and the American nonprofit ACIR. Located at the American Center in downtown New Delhi, Nexus serves as a central hub for entrepreneurs, innovators, mentors, government agencies, industry players, and funding organizations to promote Indian startups, to showcase best practices of American and Indian entrepreneurship, and to support the entrepreneurial ecosystem.

The Nexus project supports innovators through training and mentorship programs, links them to potential American and Indian investors and features the incubator as a living model for best practices in incubation.

The Nexus Incubator offers selected startups unparalleled access to networks of industry and government partners, training from the top

commercialization experts around the world, and an extensive mentor network as well as access to fund managers specializing in supporting startups. This highly competitive program offers a few select startups with sustainable business ideas critical support for their startup journey.

Nexus' resident staff and its network of American and Indian experts provide hands-on mentoring and training on practical skills including company formation, marketing, IPR, accounting, pitching, and work with funders (granting agencies, VCs and Angels).

The unparalleled extended network of the American Center and ACIR is an asset that few other incubators can match and Nexus' holistic approach, from inception to the marketplace, combined with world-class international experts, ensures that Nexus will continue to provide a unique value to its startups and to the Delhi ecosystem as a whole.

To date, Nexus has graduated 216 startups from its incubation program. These startups have gone on to raise over \$65 million in outside funding and created 9600 jobs and have closed over 106 deals with many prominent Indian and U.S. companies.
